RISE Support Services

Our goal is to empower students who were adopted-out/aged-out of foster care, by providing personal assistance, and connecting students with the following support services:

- Assistance with obtaining <u>Texas DFPS state college tuition waiver</u>
- Assistance with adopted/foster waiver submission to <u>Office of Student</u> <u>Financial Aid</u>
- Assistance with applying for the Education and Training Voucher (ETV)
- Referrals to community and government resources
- Advocacy, support, and guidance navigating university procedures and policies
- <u>Academic</u> and <u>student affairs</u> resources (tutoring, counseling, accessibility services, career services, etc.)
- Student <u>Housing</u> & Residential Life
- <u>Hawk Pantry</u> (food, school supplies/backpacks, household and hygiene items)
- Gowns for Grads (graduation gown lending program)
- Hurricane Evacuation Transportation
- Hawk Emergency Fund Grant

Criteria for eligibility

• Enrolled student

- Student receiving the TDFPS tuition exemption, or student confirmed by state or local government as currently/previously in foster care, or similar documented circumstance
- Documentation verifying the cost of expenditure
- Student in good standing with the university, or with an academic/career success plan on file
