A YEAR IN REVIEW



Dear Valued Stakeholders,

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Galveston County celebrated 10 years of best interest advocacy in FY 2024. It was a memorable year to highlight the dedicated life changing best interest advocacy that was delivered by our valued volunteers since that first day of September 2014. CASA of Galveston County's vision is to serve every child that needs the voice of a CASA volunteer while our state motto is "Every Child Has a Chance – It's YOU". It's the "YOU" in our motto that stands out as it is YOU who supports and invests in our very critical mission.

We kicked off our celebration of 10 years with revealing our 10-year logo to celebrate this amazing milestone that started with serving 35 children and over the years has grown to more than 1350 vulnerable children having a dedicated CASA volunteer to serve their best interest. More notable is that over these years, 98% of the children found permanency and have not returned to the child protection system. This statistic shows the life changes both on behalf of the children but also the caretakers to ensure lifetime networks surrounding the children are achieved.

In FY 2024, we continued our Walk a Mile that shared the story of siblings Max and Cara along the route. Each segment highlighted how their CASA volunteer participated in their life and advocated for their rights in court.

To kickoff April Child Abuse Prevention/Awareness Month, we hosted our Candlelight Vigil on the Justice Center grounds to focus on the prevalence of children in our community who are victims of alleged abuse and neglect and find themselves experiencing foster care. This evening brought our community and partners together while hearing from Torrina Harris, music by Fanfare! Lutheran Music Academy, and a resolution from our State Legislators, Senator Mayes Middleton, Representative Terri Leo-Wilson and Representative Dr. Greg Bonnen. We continued our t-shirt program to raise awareness along with our Cups of Caring initiative, partnering with local coffee shops to display our coffee sleeves. We hosted GO BLUE DAY at the CASA office for our community and volunteers to join us and were also joined by Honorable Judge Jamie Rawlinson for legal training and a note of thanks to our dedicated volunteers. Thank you to our partners who sponsored our April 2024 to raise awareness.

We concluded our year in late July 2024 with an unforgettable evening, at the Bryan Museum as it was transformed to highlight our Strength and Resilience – A Decade of Making a Difference. We honored our agency founding board members, Mr. Tim Axt, Ms. Norma Jacobson, and Ms. Katrina McGuire. Our keynote speaker, Mr. Charles Lerner (State Massachusetts CASA Director), shared his lived experience and issued a call to action to all our guests to find their way to make a difference. Chopin Mon Ami served a delightful dinner and Ms. Constance DeRome brought the tables alive with stunning florals. This event raised over \$133,000 towards realizing our mission of a CASA advocate for every child that needs one.

To enhance our advocacy over the year, we partnered with many community resources to support our families, including the Galveston County Food Bank, St. Vincent's Hope Center, Gulf Coast Center, our chambers of commerce, The Riverside Project, The Birthday Joy Program, and many more. These partnerships allow our volunteers to have access to resources to support their advocacy for children and families. It takes a community to come together for our most vulnerable population – our children and the Galveston County community is rich with caring and giving hearts.

We increased our self-care support to our volunteers through our CASA Companion and Men of CASA groups to ensure our volunteers are taking time to care for themselves so they can fully participate in their CASA volunteer responsibilities. We are so grateful for our volunteers, Mark Knox, Molly White, and Diane Manley for supporting our volunteers in this very special way.



The People on My Side The Story of "A" and Leslie, her CASA Advocate


"A" came into care in 2021 at 15 years old due to abuse. Leslie was assigned as her CASA Advocate as soon as she entered care. Leslie visited A consistently, ensuring all her health, education, and physical needs were being met.

The outcome of A's case resulted in having to prepare for independent living. A graduated from high school on May 24, 2024, and on her 18th birthday, successfully transitioned to a Supervised Independent Living (SIL) home. Leslie's advocacy did not stop there. Leslie continued to visit A, and motivated her to complete her FAFSA, apply for community college, learn how to budget, and monitor her mental health.











Program Funding Distribution for CASA of




Average Funding Distribution for Comparable Sized CASA Programs
